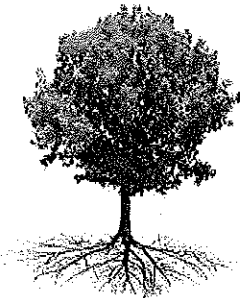

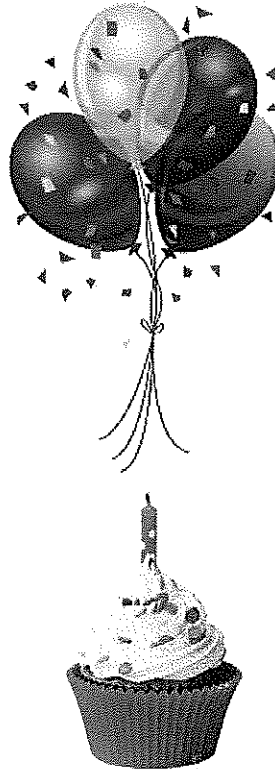

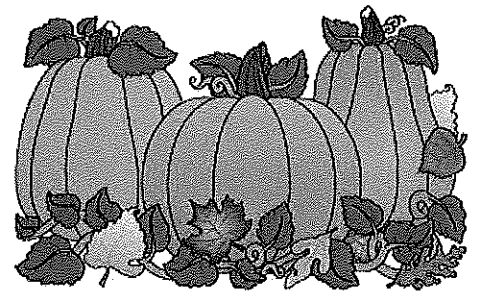

George has been a resident at Oak Village healthcare since April of 2004. George enjoys visits, so don't hesitate to come talk or share a baseball game with him.

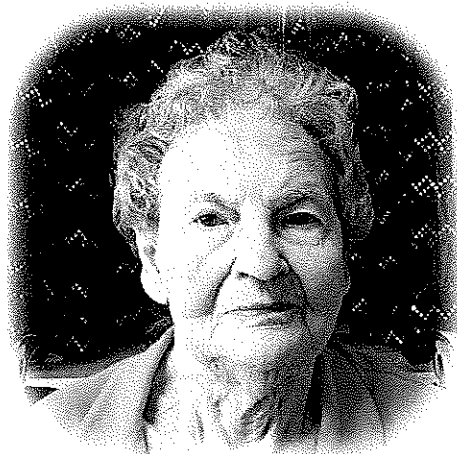
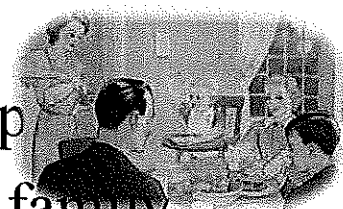

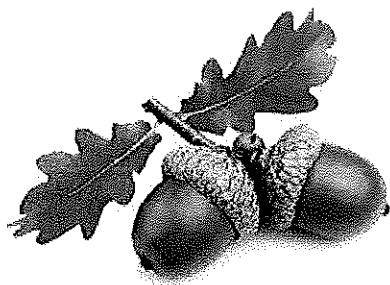
Meet Our Staff
